Sabbath Greetings to Everyone!

The issue of public trust is absolutely relevant. It is a cornerstone of a functioning nation based on individual freedom. The Founding Fathers wrote about filling the office of the presidency with those whose ""reputation for integrity inspires and merits confidence."

During the past month we have heard daily reports of sexual harassment scandals by those in positions of power or influence. It began with accusations about a candidate for the US Senate, and has spread to the entertainment industry, media, members of congress, and entertainers, just to name the most obvious. More reports are coming daily as women are encouraged to finally report what has been done to them. It is as if decades of covering up disgusting behavior is being made public. Notice the four essential qualities of those who have positions of responsibility: 1. Have the ability 2. Fear God 3. Men of Truth 4. Hating covetousness

These qualities can be summed up in the word CHARACTER. Character has been explained as "doing what is right when no one is looking" and "doing the right thing no matter what the consequences." If our leaders, politicians, and celebrities had these four qualities of character there would be no liars, corruption, or abuse of people or power. People would trust their leaders. Embarrassing revelations and disgusting news reports would be a thing of the past.
